

Instructions

Requirements

1. Work with up to 6 colours maximum
2. Your design should show something when viewed top down and from the sides.
3. The design can be enhanced with sewn on components such as buttons or bobbles.
4. Keep it simple, there's no need to over design

Step 1

There are three parts to a doggy jumper, The Body, The Chest and The Neck. Think about how your design will translate into these three components:

1. **The Body:** This is centre stage for your design. It is the design graphic as seen from the top, looking down the dog's back and from the sides.

TOP TIP: Leave a margin (approx 5 cms) below the join between the neck and the body before the centre image of the design. This allows for creasing during wear and movement which will hide some detail.

2. **The Chest Plate:** This complements the Body's graphic and is the seen from the front of the dog, covering the chest.

TOP TIP: The chest plate should blend into, or flow from the centre graphic. You could leave this in block colour if preferred.

3. **The Neck:** This complements the Body and the Chest plate, picking up the prime colour(s).

TOP TIP: Similar to the chest plate, this should blend into, or flow from the centre graphic. You could leave this in block colour if preferred.

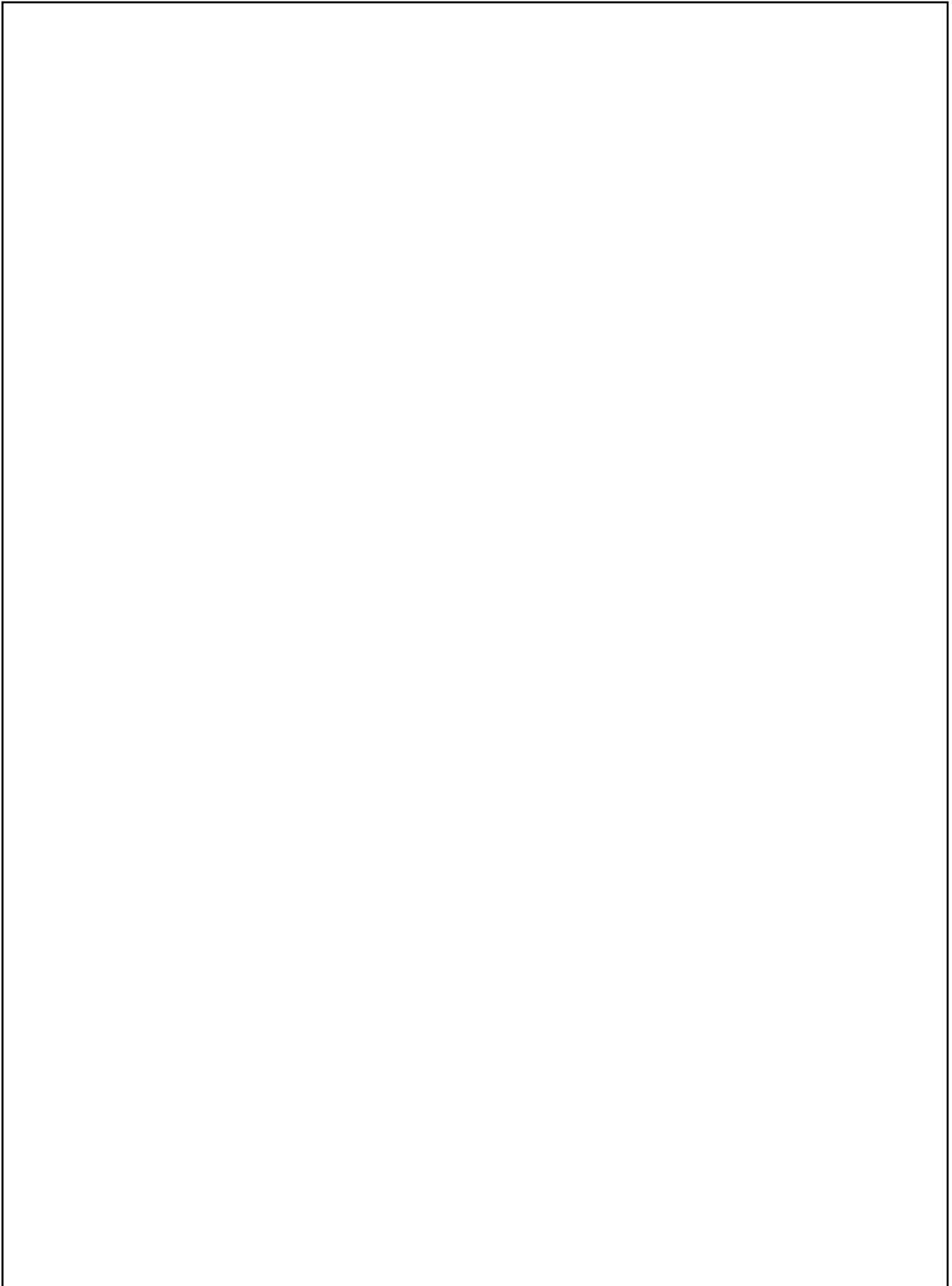
Step 3

Once you have completed your pawsome design:

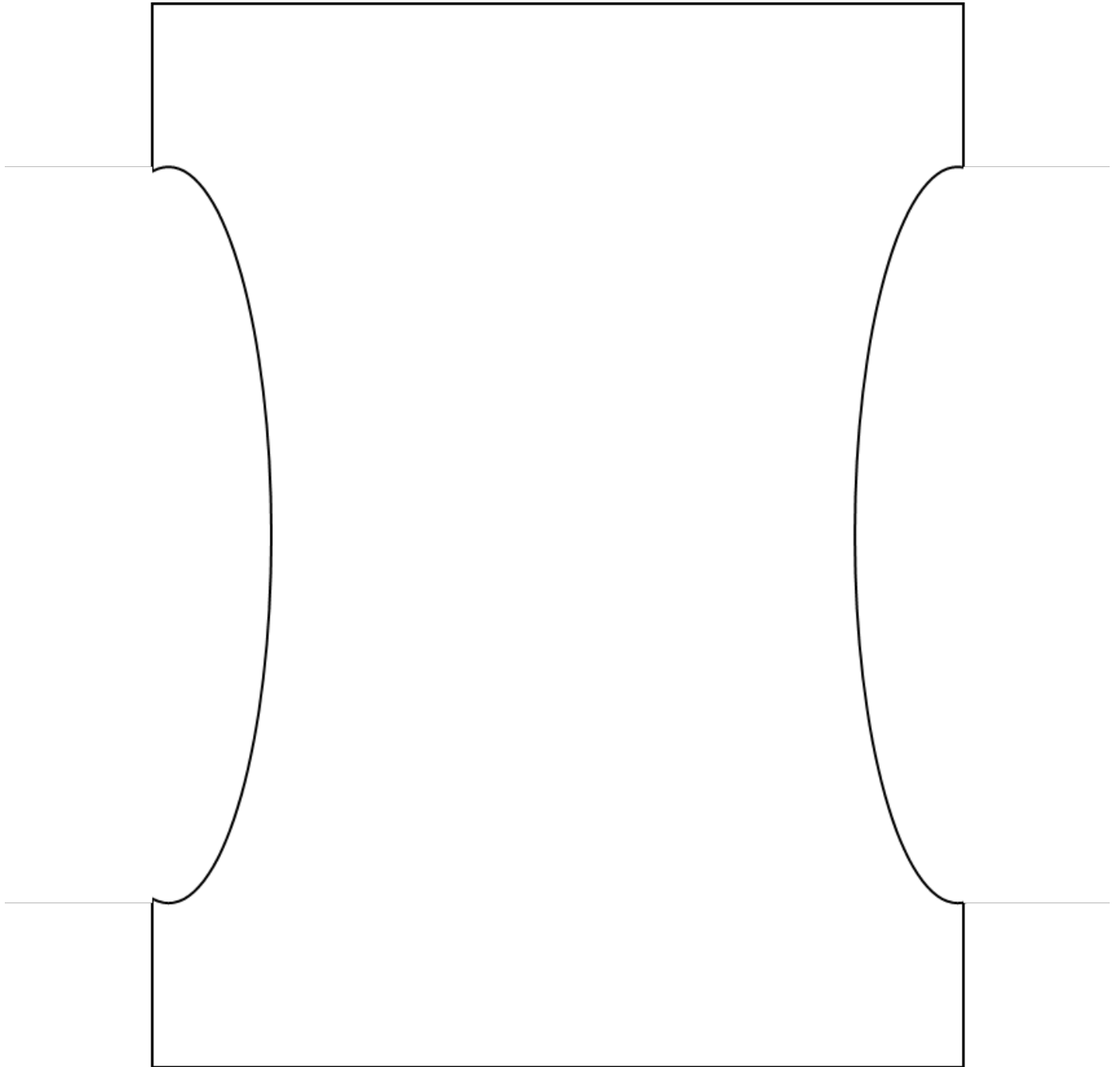
